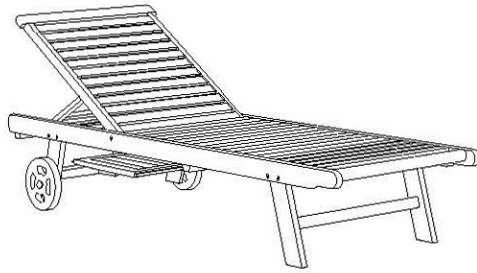

## Care & Maintenance

Your Oxford Garden furniture arrives in its natural state, without any oils or finishes. Upon completion of assembly, you may notice some staining from your hands, or possibly some water stains from shipping. Shorea is extremely dense, and therefore any staining will be only on the very surface of the wood, so any marks or abrasions can be easily removed by liberally sanding the wood with 100 grit, or medium, sandpaper.

Shorea is strong enough and weather resistant enough to be left totally untreated. If left alone, your furniture will weather naturally with time, turning a warm and soothing shade of gray. If you prefer to prevent this natural weathering, or to enhance the luster and color of the wood, you may seasonally apply a coat of teak oil. If you allow your furniture to weather, and later decide to restore it to its original condition, use a teak cleaner first, and then you may apply the teak oil. These products are available at most hardware stores and boat dealers, and are available through many Oxford Garden dealers.

If the furniture is going to be placed on a concrete or tile patio, it should first be rinsed well to remove the sawdust that may cause some staining.

## About Shorea Wood

Shorea is a tropical hardwood that grows plentifully in the Pacific Rim countries of Burma, Malaysia, and Indonesia. Shorea is closely related to teak, and is therefore well suited for use in furniture making. It is renowned for its strength, durability, and beauty. Like teak, shorea has natural oils that allow it to withstand the effects of sun, rain, snow, and frost.

# L70 - Chaise Lounge

The Oxford Garden Chaise Lounge has five component parts - chaise frame, leg assembly - head, leg assembly - foot, and two wheels.

To assemble:

1. On a clean surface, lay chaise (I) flat on its back.

Note: there are two leg assemblies, one for the foot of the chaise (J), the other for the head (H). The leg assembly for the head of the chaise (H) has holes for the wheels, and the leg assembly for the foot of the chaise does not have holes for the wheels.

2. Take the leg assembly (H) with wheel holes, and place it at the head end of the chaise, with the end of the legs pointing toward the head end of the chaise. Line up the holes in the chaise side rails (I) with the holes in the leg assembly. Attach with brass fittings (A) & (B), and tighten with allen wrench (G).

Note: the bolts (A) are inserted from the inside of side rail, and the nuts (B) are inserted on the outside of side rail. See STEP 1.

3. Attach leg assembly (J) on the foot end of the chaise, with the leg ends pointing to the foot end of the chaise. ( again, the bolt (A) must be inserted from the inside of side rail, and the nut (B) must be inserted from the outside of the rail. )

4. To attach wheels, place bolt (C) through wheel hole. Slide largest washer (D) onto bolt (C). Next slide bolt through the leg (H) from the outside. Slide smaller washer (E) onto bolt. Place nut (F) onto bolt and tighten with adjustable wrench. Repeat procedure for other wheel.

5. Turn chaise upright and enjoy.
